For overnight accommodations there are four cabins. Each has a twin bed and a double bed, a toilet and drinking water. No heat or cooking facilities in these cabins, but there is a larger cabin with a gas range where one can cook. Use of cabins is first come, first serve. (Let me know if you want to stay in a cabin. I'm not sure how this will sort itself out. For instance, I might just publish a list of people who want to stay in a cabin and ask them to work out the sleeping arrangements?) CWB folks will not be staying over night.

There is room to pitch tents or to park campers.

There is no boat ramp at Cama Beach -- boats can be launched over the beach, but one must lift boats over a low (2'?) wall. There is a boat ramp at the State Park 1.8 statute miles by water south of Cama Beach.

Marcia and I have settled on Saturday, Sep 14 for the Pickering Passage Messabout. We will launch at the west end of the bridge to Harstene. This launch site is known as Latimer's Landing.

Driving Directions:

From Shelton, NE on SR 3 for 8 mi; right (east) on Pickering Rd, go 3.2 mi; site on left just before Hartstene Island Bridge. [See the [Hammersley Inlet page](#) for maps to Shelton.]

Site Description:

This boat ramp has a moderate grade. This location experiences moderate tidal currents. The concrete panels are placed lengthwise on the lower section of the ramp giving the ramp an uneven surface. This site is the only access on saltwater around Hartstene Island.

If we launch at 10 am, that would give us time for a long row/sail/paddle -- maybe even south around Squaxin Island--a distance of about 13 miles. Or maybe just south and around Hope Island, a distance of about 9 miles. Or, north to the north end of Hartstene and back, a distance of about 12 miles. Or not so far as any of these? (All statute miles.)

So, we propose to meet at 10 a.m. at Latimer's Landing. Bring lunch for a picnic on a beach. There are many excellent places to land.
